Summary of PPSG 2020-21

Objectives of spending PPSG -

- To have ensured that by July 2021 a detailed PE curriculum map covering all year groups and showing clear progression and skills to be taught has been enacted across all year groups.
- To be in a position by the end of Term 6 whereby all PE delivery can take place through 'in house teaching' ready for the next academic year.
- To appoint a 'PE coach/teacher' who will be responsible for whole class teaching, (across all year groups) afterschool clubs, taking children to competitions and running intervention groups focusing on hand-eye coordination skills.
- To provide inclusive learning to all children, allowing them all the opportunity to have access to vigorous physical activity.
- Despite Covid restrictions, to take advantage of any competitive opportunities that arise particularly Wiltshire cricket.
- To allow school to compete in the official football competitions organised by Swindon P.S.F.A. (Year 5 and Year 6) and in the Fortius competitions especially those within the school's local environment – Athletics track and Foundation Park.
- To ensure that the PE Coordinator and any newly appointed 'PE coach/teacher' complete all necessary liaison in order for the entire PE curriculum to be delivered 'in-house' in 2021-22.
- To develop a love of sport and physical activities through inclusive and challenging lessons.
- To promote a healthy and active lifestyle for all children.
- To develop Physical Activity in lessons beyond the PE curriculum.
